2.0 WOTCLEF 2024 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2024, WOTCLEF reached a teeming number of over 10 million persons in the general public via the media-social and traditional.

With about 5000 school children reached by the National Youth Service Corps Scheme group via WOTCLEF sensitization and the Corps Members' in-school campaigns led by the Eco Vanguard Community Development Service (CDS) was no little feat.

The Shelter accommodated over 30 persons from Cote d'Ivoire and internal cases.

Rescue missions were from Ghana, Mali, Cote D'ivore and Internally within Nigeria.

A quarter of a century of WOTCLEF's establishment was on Tuesday October 29, 2024. WOTCLEF's Founder, Her Excellency Chief (Mrs.) Titi Atiku Abubakar, personally organised the 25th anniversary of the organisation at the National Centre for Women Development, Abuja, where the man who signed the Anti Trafficking Bill, 21 years ago and her husband, Former President Olusegun Obasanjo and Former Vice President Atiku Abubakar respectively graced the occasion, with other dignitaries.

The wife of the President, Senator Oluremi Tinubu was represented by the wife of the Vice President, Hajia Nana Shetimma.

The first quarter of 2024 began with one of its kind project from the Switzerland Embassy themed Enhancing Capacity In Traumainformed Care for Survivors of Trafficking and Child Labour.

The Swiss Project as it was popularly referred to spanned with 9 trainings till August.

The unique context is that 60 persons including Board of Trustee, staff, volunteers, survivors, their school heads, counsellors, teachers, representative of religious groups were all sitted under one roof at WOTCLEF Conference Hall.

2.1 WOTCLEF, NYSC AWARENESS RAISING

WOTCLEF continued its awareness raising at all fronts- media, inschools, community, online.

Community awareness raising with other partners such as in a community at Suleja aside in-school campaigns took place.

2.2 RESCUE, REHABILITATION, EMPOWERMENT AND REINTEGRATION

The voices of the Survivors led the way at WOTCLEF rehabilitation centre. They were in charge of the support activities such as procurement, shopping feeding, assistance support in shelter administration. They were opportuned to attend other trainings for intensive awareness raising by Media Campaign Against Human Trafficking (MeCAHT).

Their WOTCLEF Youth Parliament was active as well as their leadership groups. In marking the International Days, WOTCLEF Treasures took charge. For instance, they were speakers at the inschool campaigns for the World Day Against Human Trafficking, International Day of the Girl Child where they played Hosts. The uniqueness of the day was the fact that all speakers were HeforShes.

2.3 PARTNERSHIPS/INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS

WOTCLEF Founder, WOTCLEF Former Boss together with NACTAL Executives and members of the West African Collation Against Trafficking In Persons and Smuggling of Migrants (WACTIPSOM), were at a retreat on Counter Trafficking as supported by ATIPSOM. WOTCLEF interfaced with the European Union delegation and their Ambassadors and Embassies such as the Switzerland and Austria. NETWORKING with NACTAL, CPN, WCA, ECM remains ongoing.

BEYOND STATISTICS: OVER 24 MILLION CHILDREN IN CHILD LABOUR IN NIGERIA- 2022 NATIONAL BUREAUOF STATISTICS SURVEY.



A staggering 24, 673,485 children have been revealed to be victims of child labour in Nigeria.

This was made known at the

ECOWAS Secretariat, Asokoro, Abuja, Nigeria, on Thursday April 18, 2024, at the official presentation of the result of tripartite a collaboration between the International Labour Organisation (ILO), Abuja, the Federal Ministry of Labour and Employment, Bauchi Office National the

Bureau of Statistics (NBS), Headquarters, Abuja.

At the invitation of NBS, WOTCLEF witnessed the launch of the survey which was conducted in the 36 States of the Federation including the Federal Capital Territory, (FCT).

Quality and reliable statistical information on Child and Forced Labour in Nigeria which includes the prevalence, characteristics, causes and consequences of theinvolvement of children aged 5-17 years in Labour activities.

Other insights of the research include the prevalence of children's work, hazardouswork, unpaid household services by sex, age group and area of residence either urban or rural.

Out of the 62,900,479 children between 5-17 years old in Nigeria, 31,756,302 children are involved in various economic activities, with 39.2% representing 31,756,302 children in child labour.

Furthermore, 22.9% representing 14,390,353 children are involved in hazardouswork.

The highest prevalence is in the South-East at 49.9%, and the lowest prevalence in the South-West at 27.5%.





To enhance quick access to justice and reduce cases of gender-based violence, sexual assault, and bullying, the Minister of Women Affairs, Bar. Uju Kennedy-Ohanenye has unveiled a mobile court for this purpose.

This strategic expansion aims to strengthen the network's ability to assist victims, advocate for stronger policies, and coordinate antitrafficking efforts not just throughout Nigeria but the West African region as a whole.



A sensitization program on

human trafficking and the deceptive tactics used bytraffickers was conducted at Government Secondary School (GSS) Gwarinpa.

The aim was to educate students and teachers on the dangers of human trafficking, recognize the signs, and understand the methods traffickers employ to lure victims.

Our Objective was:

- 1. To raise awareness about human trafficking.
- 2. To educate students on the tactics used by traffickers.
- 3. To provide information on how to seek help and report suspicious activities.

Students from various classes and teachers participated. We emphasised on tactics used by traffickers, for example, false job offers, promising lucrative jobs abroad or in big cities, Deceptive Relationships, Pretending to be romantically interested or offering marriage, Kidnapping individuals for trafficking, btargeting individuals in desperate situations, such as those in poverty or conflict zones, luring victims through socialmedia platforms with false promises.

Students were encouraged on how to stay safe and avoid becoming a victim especially as the school is embarking on a long holiday this period and always. Students asked questions and shared their concerns, which were addressed by ourteam.

In Conclusion, the sensitization program at GSS Gwarinpa was a success, despite the heavy rain down-pour, providing essential information and fostering a safer, more informed school.


